Tigers enjoy clean sweep over the Blues

The Tigers had a full roster of games against the Hinterland Blues at the Den this weekend with the main game in the Hart Sport Cup QFA Division 1 at 2pm yesterday.

The Blues are packed with talent and have been giving the competition plenty to think about all year so despite the Tigers good recent form there was no room for complacency. The Blues boast some big bodies and plenty of handy skills which were on show yesterday from the opening bounce.

The first term was a bruising period where both sides

threw everything at each other with both midfields getting into the action but the defence was solid at either end.

The Tigers defence has been a feature this year and once again James Stolz led the way with another composed performance while Jeremy Duck and Will Brohm were creative setting the Tigers up for plenty of rebound action. Daniel Schmidt has settled into his new role as the tall key defender taking plenty of intercept marks to play an important role. It was a team effort in the men's department all day as they held league leading Blues goal kicker Rhys Magin to just two majors while the strong marking Thomas Wischnat could only register one for the day albeit his radar was not working as it usually does. The Tigers would be well pleased with their back six.

The term concluded with the Tigers taking a one goal lead after a very tense period with the Blues looking very dangerous.

It was however a different story in the second term as the Tigers got off the leash to kick six goals with Ryan Doolan and Zac McLean working beautifully together taking full advantage of the effort from the Tigers midfield. Doolan was marking everything to be a real handful going on to kick six while Skipper McLean was creative as usual giving directions and making sure structures were in place as he helped himself to another five goals to go on from his haul last week.

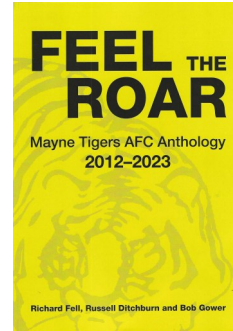

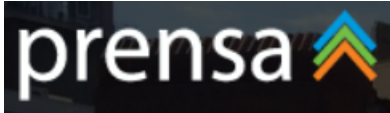
