

Blasts from the Past

In the Tigers centenary year we remember our great people from the last 100 years who have made plenty of history through their support and involvement.

This week we remember Peter Cubis.

Peter "Cubo" Cubis – Peter was another talented player from the Ascot SS footy nursery after the family moved from Tenterfield. Starting as a junior in 1961 he played in junior premierships as a stand out, fleet footed, skillful rover.


A beautiful stab pass he was super accurate around goal. "Cubo" played for Queensland at under 17 level and was awarded the best player award in the match against NSW, and then in 1968 when he was captain, he won the Clem Ryan medal for the league's best in the Colts with a record 35 votes! During the late 60's he also coached several junior teams successfully assisted by Tyrone Stewart and Trevor 'Polly' Hardwick.



Progressing to senior footy he played over 50 games when the club had several star small men making it difficult to cement a spot, so Peter decided to head over to Banyo in 1970 where he

became a club icon coaching the club to back-toback flags in 1972/73 and another flag with the "twos" in 1980, along with another senior premiership as a player in 75. He then had many years on the committee and as president. A Life Member of the Bloods!
