The Mayne and Coorparoo Football Clubs came together yesterday to continue their historic rivalry in the Annual Anzac Day Clash at the Den.

This has become one of the most important and celebrated games in both clubs calendar with the rivalry being reinvigorated in 2018 in a salute to the epic encounters of times past but not forgotten.

After a moving Anzac Day ceremony which included the Pipes and Drums National Servicemen's Memorial Band the game was underway in perfect conditions for football.

It was also a great day for the Tigers with much loved club

man Jordan Morrison running out for his 100th senior game for the club.

The Tigers burst out of the blocks with a three goal blitz with Zac Quin, Zac McLean and Jamie Ivers into the action straight away to shock the Kings who took half a quarter to find their feet and get on the board.

The Tigers finished with four goals for the quarter to hold a three goal advantage over the 2023 grand finalists in an impressive start.

It was a different story in the second term with the game opening up as both sides adopted an attacking strategy playing on at all costs. The ball was in constant motion as it went from end to end in frenetic fashion. It was also a goal for goal shootout with both sides hitting the scoreboard. While Zac Quin was once again in dynamic form as he went on to record seven goals, Kings spearhead Jack Gilhooley was able to kick five goals at the other end. Quin now has twenty five goals from four games in a great start to his season.

The Tigers held on to the two goal lead at the main break with the game well in the balance for an exciting second half to come.

The Tigers Beau Harris has been a revelation this year as one of the midfield prime movers. He has pace to burn and with his closing speed and effective tackling there is rarely
