Bart commented that everyone will remember the night the club came together to celebrate 100 years and they were there.

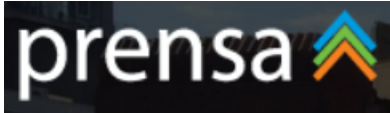
